



A Message from our President

2024 was a record year for **FCM Cares!** With the generous donations of our partners, employees, family and friends, we raised close to \$245,000 through our various events, campaigns and fundraising efforts. More importantly, we are proud to share we distributed over \$208,000 to 86 charities all across the US in the communities we serve. Because of your generous giving, **FCM Cares was able to help support 49 new organizations this year, increasing our giving by 91%!**

Please take a moment to explore this report to see a detailed picture of how FCM Cares helped impact our communities. We are honored to have had the opportunity to touch so many lives under our pillars of Women and Children, Education, Veterans and Housing. Here are just a few of the ways your giving has made a difference:

In March, we fired up our employees with a competition called **Make-A-Wish** Madness to win the opportunity to host a Make-A-Wish Grant Party in their community. We had no idea just how competitive our coworkers are! Ryan Keifer, VP Branch Manager in the greater Cincinnati area, rallied the Midwest Region to victory over the Southeastern Region by raising \$3000 more than the SE. **In total, our employees raised \$6,682 of the \$15,000 donated to regional Make-A-Wish chapters.**

In October, FCM Cares hosted the 11th Annual Tyler Morrissey Memorial Golf Tournament (TMO). The weather was absolutely perfect for fellowship, networking and a round of golf. We were so grateful to see sponsorship and participation return to pre-pandemic numbers. We are ecstatic to share that together we raised \$60,000! Plans are underway for our 12th Annual TMO, please plan to join us this Fall for another great event.

FCM Cares' last campaign of 2024 was the annual **Great Holiday Give Back!** Our employees selected **16 non-profits** that they have a personal connection with to highlight. Learning from the success of our Make-A-Wish Madness campaign, we encouraged some friendly competition between the non-profits. FCM Cares provided a platform for raising funds, marketing and social media support, and matched up to \$2000 raised per non-profit. Plus, the top five fundraising teams received an additional \$500 for their non-profit. **In total, our employees helped raise \$64,000 of the \$86,000 FCM Cares distributed in December 2024.**

On behalf of the FCM Cares Board of Directors, we are humbled and appreciative of all that we have been able to accomplish with your continued support. Together we will continue to empower kindness through acts of service and charity.

Empowering Futures

Under our Education Pillar, we provide scholarships like the Andrew C. Rambo Memorial Scholarship for Middle Tennessee State University MBA students and the J.C. Gordon Scholarship for Tennessee College of Applied Technology students in Machine Tool Technology. We also support various education initiatives, including donations to local schools, Hope Station for working mothers, MTSU's Raider Closet for interview attire, and Read to Succeed's Spelling Bee.

Stuff the Backpacks

In July, FCM Cares called on our employees to donate backpacks and back-to-school supplies purchased through an Amazon Wish List. During the July Summit Meeting, members of FCM's leadership team were divided into groups for a relay race to stuff the backpacks. Thanks to our generous employee donations, we were able to stuff 100 backpacks (each valued at a minimum of \$50), with only \$600 in supplemental supplies purchased by FCM Cares. Every Summit attendee was offered the opportunity to bring an allotment of backpacks back to their home state to donate locally. When it was discovered that the spouse of one of the employees worked in a school with at risk Kindergarteners, several of the participants donated their allotment of backpacks to this school. What a testament to FCM's generous giving!











Grandi Nan Nou

Grandi Nan Nou Home Ministries is a nonprofit in Haiti that is run by a local couple, Shelby and Jameson Toyo, in Murfreesboro, TN. They use education as a tool to facilitate safe and authentic Christian community. The Toyos have a school and home in Haiti that is open to the community and children in the area. Their home typically has around 20 people living with them and the school can accommodate 300 students that come to learn English, Discipleship, reading, and various trades from electricity, plumbing, construction, etc. Jameson is a native Haitian and shared with us the terrifying needs of those in the community. FCM Cares was proud to support the Toyo's efforts.

Inspiredu

The FCM IT (Information Technology) Department was working on decommissioning 50 FCM laptops that were no longer in use. Rather than recycling these machines, they had the idea to partner with an Atlanta-based non-profit, Inspiredu. Inspiredu is an organization that works with youth in low-income areas to ensure they have the technology needed to succeed in school. Our very own EVP of Service Assurance, Danny Baute, serves on the Executive and Tech Committee for Inspiredu. Along with the laptops, FCM Cares sent a monetary donation to support the efforts of Inspiredu.

Andy Rambo MBA Scholarship

Middle Tennessee State University awarded Nicole Bauer the 8th annual FCM Cares Andrew C. Rambo Memorial Scholarship for \$7,500. This scholarship was established in memory of Andy Rambo, long-time board chair for First Community Bank and board member for First Community Mortgage. Rambo practiced law for 42 years intending to always learn and serve his community. Nicole plans to graduate with her MBA by Spring 2026. She then plans to position herself for a managerial role in her family's company to encourage the growth of the company and continue her family's legacy. Nicole is a full-time employee and part-time student; she stated that receiving the scholarship provided validation to her goals and alleviated financial and emotional burdens of managing work and school. Before pursuing her MBA, Nicole received a bachelor's in Speech-Language Pathology because she loves being involved in the special needs community. Nicole looks forward to being equipped to assist in her family business with her MBA while also actively volunteering with the special needs community.







Read to Succeed

Read to Succeed sponsored their annual fundraiser, The Celebrity Spelling Bee! The event was filled with entertainment from bidding on auction items, enjoying a great meal, and watching the Spelling Bee itself. FCM Cares was proud to help them exceed their goal of \$60,000 for that evening. Read to Succeed provides books to new teachers, reading in schools events, adult literacy programs, high school book clubs and more.

Mortgage Bound

FCM Cares played a pivotal role in supporting a groundbreaking curriculum at Middle Tennessee State University. Taught by industry leaders and in partnership with the Mortgage Bankers Association, the MBA Mortgage Bound - Careers in Mortgage Lending course provides invaluable insights into the mortgage industry for both students and adults. As part of our commitment to support professional development, we also sponsored two FCM employees. Their attendance helps enrich our team's expertise and foster strong industry connections. Together, we're shaping the future of the mortgage industry and investing in the growth of our community.



JC Gordon

FCM Cares, in combination with the JC Gordon family, presented the seventh annual scholarship to worthy students attending the Machine Tool Technology program at Tennessee College of Applied Technology. The scholarship assists 15 students in the purchase of tools and items needed to complete the program. JC Gordon, a founder of First Community Mortgage, had a heart for student development in all types of education, but especially with those attending tech school. Gordon helped to train students of TCAT through an internship program with his company, WEGO Precision Machine. JC Gordon's legacy of support continues through this annual scholarship.

DACC

FCM Cares was grateful provide a donation to support the annual DACC scholarship in Ohio. This scholarship was created to support dental assistant students and was started by a previous FCM employee.

The family wished for his legacy to live on through a scholarship to high school athletes in their college pursuits. We are honored Cara thought of us to assist in building his legacy by giving to the scholarship fund. The tournament raised \$50,000 and was able to provide six scholarships.



Building Foundations

Our Housing Pillar hosts a variety of events, including a yearly fundraiser for Habitat for Humanity with a brunch featuring guest speakers on health, wellness, and financial fitness, and a comedy night. We also organize Hammer Down for Habitat, a scenic 95-mile ride with poker, Party in the House for New Life Furniture Bank, and offer volunteer opportunities to assist with Habitat Builds.

Habitat Build - Robert Rose

On Saturday, April 6th, FCM Cares hosted a Habitat for Humanity Panel Build in the parking lot at Riverview Corporate in Murfreesboro. FCM Cares was awarded the opportunity to host the panel build as a thank you for helping to raise \$15K for the Rutherford County Area Habitat for Humanity at our Comedy Night in the spring of 2023. Volunteers from FCM, AMB, International Paper, plus present and future Habitat Homeowners worked with the local Habitat for Humanity team to build all the walls for the home in less than 7 hours. The future homeowners, Aiko and Cody, were overwhelmed with joy when they stood in what would be their son's future bedroom!

















Groovin in the Boro

For a second year, FCM Cares sponsored The Journey Homes' Groovin' in the Boro. This year's event was extra special as it helped push The Journey Home over their capital campaign goal of \$5.7 million. We are happy to report the Journey Home has broken ground on the site of their new 20,000 sq. ft. facility to support the physical and mental health needs of vulnerable, disadvantaged, and displaced individuals and families in the Murfreesboro, TN community. The new facility will include a space to serve meals, rooms for counseling, showers for the homeless, and 10 short-term family units designated to keeping families together while The Journey Home helps to secure long-term, stable housing for the families.









Habitat Dedication

In April, FCM Cares hosted a Habitat for Humanity Panel Build in the parking lot at Riverview Corporate in Murfreesboro. In August, FCM Cares was honored to be invited to be a part of the home dedication ceremony for Aiko, Cody and their son. Tricia Pohlman said, "Over the years I have been a part of many Habitat for Humanity build days, but this was the first time I've attended a home dedication. 
Veteran Impact Celebration

The event netted an amazing \$25,493, which will go directly to The Davis Focus Project mission to empower veterans through human performance programming.

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Supporting Families

Our Women and Children Pillar organizes impactful events like coat drives, donations to fight human trafficking, and sponsorship of the Boys and Girls Club's Stake and Burger event. We also support back-to-school drives, donate to Reading Hospital, match donations for the Isaiah 117 House, and sponsor food at the Young Life Golf Classic. Each year, we grant a child's wish through Make-a-Wish, including a special Disney celebration for Remmington.

Reading Hospital NICU

Autumn Gordon, Compliance Coordinator, celebrated her 10th year of fundraising for the Reading Hospital NICU by providing thermal tote bags for mothers with babies in the NICU. These totes allow mothers to travel to and from the NICU with breast milk for their sweet babies. For Autumn's tenth year, in combination with an FCM Cares donation, she was able to collect 140 beautiful totes for donation. A decade of this fundraiser has equated to a total donation of 744 totes for these families.

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Gabriel's Horn

We are so thankful to Amanda McKenzie and her teammate for wanting to gather donations in support of Gabriel's Horn, a Women's Shelter in Portage, Indiana. Gabriel's Horn seeks to provide shelter, education, counseling and community connections to women and children experiencing homelessness. We are happy to say that thanks to the hard work of Amanda and her team, as well as an FCM Cares match, we played a part in helping Gabriel's Horn accomplish their goal to pay off the mortgage and serve more women and children.

Addiction is a non-profit based in Middle Tennessee
dedicated to the employment of women survivors
of human trafficking, addiction, domestic violence
and incarceration. They provide programs to enrich
their lives and career coaching while providing
participants meaningful work through their catering
company and a support network. The ladies
participating in the program catered a lovely lunch
buffet including an elaborate dessert table. The
comedian was hilarious and several attendees from
FCM/AMB won their silent auction bids.

Nicotine & Vape Awareness Program (NOVA)

A previous Loan Originator asked FCM Cares to make a donation to the local NOVA chapter in El Paso, Texas. NOVA Initiative is a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization that focuses on bringing attention to vape prevention and nicotine education through the means of research supported workshops. NOVA Initiative focuses on using the information gathered, along with other sources of literature, to create a research-based educational program. The program aims to educate students on how vaping can cause harm to their brains and mental health.

Doors of Hope Golf Tournament

Doors of Hope is a nonprofit that empowers women to break the cycle of addiction, homelessness and incarceration. Brave Run






Cassba
